

Corona News New world's fastest PCR test 25.09.2020

32.3 million infections worldwide Germany reached 283,000 with 9451 deaths

First of all, I would like to report to the Ministry of Health, Press Office, Citizen Service and Mr. Spahn personally on September 6th, 2020. It was about the fact that the Ministry of Health has announced that it wants to give away 26,000 ventilators and around 275,000,000 masks to needy countries because the ventilators are too many and the masks have a tight expiration date. And then it started: Spahn did not answer, of course, the press office allegedly passed it on to the appropriate offices and I received 4 messages from the GS procurement staff of the Ministry of Health, Section L4; because I kept asking for every answer.

I was told that the masks would be passed on to service providers, among other things, via the Association of Statutory Health Insurance Physicians as required. No information about my order and the expiry date, as I said, not even after the 4th email. So I don't believe the story with the expiration date. However, I asked various statutory health insurance associations about possible deliveries from the federal government. ONLY the Lower Saxony National Association of Statutory Health Insurance Physicians answered, the Federal Association is also silent. Lower Saxony sent a very detailed list of masks, smocks, overalls, disinfectants, etc. As I said, there is still no information on the expiry date, which I have entrusted the press office with again today.

At some point it will work out. By the way, a little anecdote about the citizen service: I called Berlin and Bonn because of a lack of information, you won't be connected. When I complained about the missing answer with the expiry date, but reported about 4 reply emails, the answer was: "These are the answers you got". When I pointed out that the indication of the expiry date was still missing, the great info: "You have to ask the question differently". Oh, they don't understand German. I couldn't have known. In addition, around 15% of the 1.2 billion masks in Germany are said to be out of order under government control and therefore not usable. Of course, they don't want to pay for this either, the suppliers want money, and lawsuits are now pending. It is still unclear who is checking and, above all, what checks whether and why the masks are unsuitable. If it's that easy, there shouldn't be any fine for Spahn, sorry, for the taxpayers. But in the end everything will look different again, time hides all wounds. Okay, another topic.

In France, citizens take to the streets: Again, lockdowns in certain areas are intended to at least mitigate the daily increase in new infections with Corona. Of course, this also applies to businesses that have not yet recovered from the first wave. Some operators have already announced that they will oppose the orders. But that doesn't help either, you'd better thank the many stubborn citizens, party-mad citizens, wedding-mad and similar groups and especially young people who just give a shit about the rules and take a break from it. Sometimes with the attitude that they themselves would only be mildly affected, if at all, and that they are not interested in others. Only when this mixed poke has been brought to its senses does it go up again. Of course, this also applies to others.

Countries where these groups operate. Sayings like "Save our existence" and simply ignoring requirements will not save any stores.

How much you can rely on the sayings of v.d.Leyen and their society in the EU, about cohesion, humanity, solidarity blablabla you can now see again in the matter of the Corona aid package. I and certainly you as a reader had thought that the large € 750 billion package was long gone and paid off, you think. The large aid package allegedly approved in July 2020 may not come about at all, except for Dummdeutschland who pays the sums that others do not want to pay. Because: Around a third of the EU countries do not approve the budget. It is about inconsistencies in the capital adequacy decision. Some countries fear an "incorrect" implementation, reallocation of funds and more. That's why they don't want to agree at first. So the big package is on hold for now, as it was so urgently needed - allegedly. So this is called "Great EU cohesion".

And students have also benefited from the corona aid so far. In the 4 months and until the end of September, 135,000 students qualified for bridging assistance, over 60% of them received the maximum grant of 500 euros. So far, around 60 million euros have been paid out. It's amazing how many students suddenly become impoverished when there is an opportunity to collect money from the state. The State Secretary of the Federal Ministry of Education and Research, Dr. Master, take a positive view of the matter. We know. Spending money that does not belong to the state but is always fun for the taxpayer.

Finally, some positive news from the German economy: Bosch Healthcare Solutions GmbH Waiblingen has developed a new Corona rapid test in cooperation with R-Biopharm, which is said to be the world's fastest PCR-based point-of-care test for SARS-CoV-2 should be. A reliable result should be available in 39 minutes. Therefore this test form is ideal for use e.g. in mobile and quickly set up test centers or local conditions where the results must be available in a short time. The sensitivity of this test is 98% and the specificity 100%. So-called pooling should enable 5 people to test simultaneously with one cartridge. The test is available immediately within Europe. The capacities are currently still low, however, since a special analysis device is required for the test. Bosch wants to achieve the capacity of 1 million tests by the end of 2020.
